Instructions

Cut out the pictures and mix them up. You could begin with just 2 sets of pictures before building up to sorting pictures from all 5 sets.

Go through each picture first with your child and tell them the correct word for each one. This is important because some pictures could represent alternative words. For example, pig for hog or mouse for rat.

Once you've given the correct word for each picture, ask your child to sort them into groups that rhyme. If they struggle, give them some help...

“Does dog rhyme with log and fog or rat and hat?”

It's up to you whether or not you use the printed words alongside the pictures. You could try sorting without the printed words first and then introduce them afterwards. Draw your child's attention to the common letters in the spellings for each set, but mention the letter sounds rather than the letter names.
